Amputee Golf Charities

January 3, 2012

A check for \$1,000 was sent to the National Amputee Golf Association (NAGA). This was money donated in Chuck Sutton's name specifically for the NAGA's Educational Scholarship Fund. (Note: Because of lack of applicants for the Henry Brown Memorial Educational Scholarship, 2011 donations were sent to the NAGA.)

June 5, 2011

The 18th Annual Amputee Tournament Players Championship was completed this past week with 40 amputee players from 12 states participating in the Amputee TPC (Friday and Saturday) and/or the Sponsor Scramble (Thursday).

With temperatures again in the mid-to-upper 90's, the 2011 tournament was a complete success as 30 amputees competed for 6 division titles in the 2-day tournament. (Note: There were 10 Amputees that only played in the Sponsor Scramble.)

October 12, 2010

Henry Brown Memorial Educational Scholarship Program established.

Amputee Golf Charities has established a scholarship program in Henry Brown's name. Henry, an amputee golfer, created Amputee Golf Charities in 2003 and served as its President until his death in a farm accident in April 2008. This scholarship will be in the form of a one time grant, to be awarded annually in July. Any amputee enrolled in a post-secondary education institution is eligible to apply. 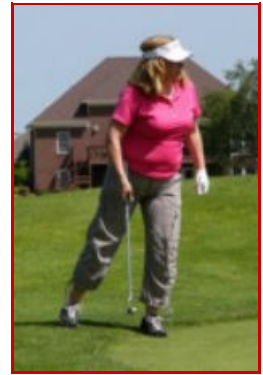

A check for \$655 was sent to the National Amputee Golf Association (NAGA) for the their Educational Scholarship Fund.

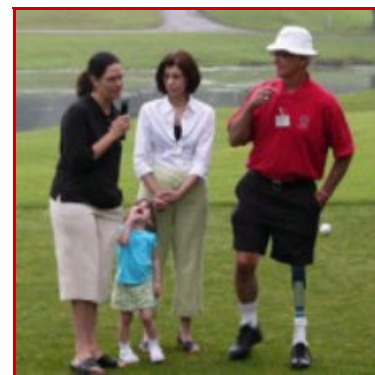
June 10, 2006

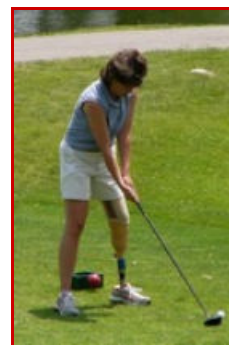
June 10, 2005
